#### Introducing Rainbow House Four

In March 2019 Rainbow Living announced that the charity was moving forward with plans for Rainbow House Four in Exeter, following continued demand in the local area.

A 6-bedroom property was purchased in September 2019, providing accommodation for five tenants and a bedroom for support staff.

Work to renovate the house began immediately. As Rainbow Living had been in close contact with the families of the future tenants, we were able to ensure that every single adaptation and renovation was done with the future tenants' individual and specific needs in mind.




### Accessibility

As with all Rainbow Houses, there was a need to ensure accessible provision at Rainbow House Four, as well as future-proof the house.

Work to form a ramp at the front of the property was undertaken; the ramp was designed to blend with the existing brickwork, and creates a seamless journey from the drive to the house.




#### **Entrance hall**

The entrance hall was painted and re-carpeted and is now a large light space.

The original staircase was quite narrow so work was undertaken to replace with a wider one. The original spindles were re-used and painted, with a new banister put in. Contrasting tread edges were fitted on the stairs to assist those with visual impairment.

The house has been fitted with a hard wire fire system, and all the rooms have smoke detectors. Provision for sufficient Wi-Fi for everyone was also put in place with data cabling throughout the house.



Throughout the house, the door frames and architrave have been painted a complimentary darker colour to contrast with the walls, and all plug sockets and light switches are in contrast colour.

This was done to support tenants who are visually impaired as the colour contrast will help them to be able to move confidently, independently and safely around the house and be able to more easily identify switches.

The colours used give the house a clean and modern look.





## The Lounge

The lounge was painted and decorated throughout.

It has been furnished with sofas, some furniture and new curtains.

With windows to the front and rear, the room is a large bright and welcoming space in which the tenants can come together as a family.

The patio doors provide views and access into the rear garden.







## Kitchen and utility room


The kitchen has been completely renovated. Walls were taken down, angles and edges removed and taken back being replaced with straight lines to create a clear open space.

The kitchen has a clean modern look; every aspect was designed to support tenants independence; appliances were carefully chosen to suit the tenants needs and include a talking microwave!

The utility room off the kitchen was recreated and renovated so that an ensuite for the downstairs bedroom could be created.

### Dining room



The wall separating the dinning room and kitchen was partly removed, opening up the space to create a large bright kitchen diner, though with a clear separation of space.

Removing the wall created a more sociable space for tenants and there is plenty of room for the dining table and chairs so the tenants can come together for meals.

Wooden flooring has been laid and the room decorated and furnished.

#### Bedrooms

Sound proofing was installed in the walls between the upstairs bedrooms and the bedroom downstairs.

All tenants chose the paint colour for their bedrooms, and it's great to see the variety of colours selected and how lovely and bright they all are.

The tenants will all bring their own furniture and soft furnishings with them when they move in.







The downstairs bedroom was renovated so that an ensuite wet room could be created to meet specific need and to support independence.



#### Bathrooms

Three bedrooms have ensuites and two male tenants will share a further bathroom.

One of the tenants using this bathroom is partially sighted so two hand basins were put in to support the tenant in knowing which sink and wash items are his.

Showers have been fitted, baths and sinks replaced and heating towels installed in every bathroom.





## Staff bedroom & ensuite

To support tenants during overnight stays, there is provision for staff to sleep over. An ensuite bathroom was constructed for this bedroom.







## The garden

The garden to the rear of the house has been tidied and cleared.

The steps were re-built and a handrail installed.
